

Invasive Plant Workshop

The Town of Woodstock Conservation Commission is conducting an open hearing on April 18, 2018 at 7:00 pm, to inquire about our current issues and propose solutions related to invasive and pest flora, especially wild parsnip, giant hogweed, garlic mustard and wild chervil. Although other plants are also on the list of Vermont invasives (see vtinvasive.org) these four seem particularly aggressive at this time in our area, and can be seen taking over our scenic roadways and fields.

We will have representative from the town and state, local experts and of course, citizens of Woodstock speak about the issue: Just how bad is it? What can be done? What else can be done that isn't being done now? What would a 5-year or 10-year plan look like and at what cost? We look forward to your participation.
