  Bookstack partners with the History Center, St. James Church, UU, Artistree, woodstack Inn, Yeuler Bookstore, many of the local BiB's, the Norman williams Library. Everyone who works on the Jestival are woodstock area residents. Also the Thompson Senior Center, Congregation Shir Shalom

  We local track of now many people affect each presentation. In the last size years we have increased the number of presentations to nearly 40 and last year averaged 41 people per presentation. 5 years ago, approximately 30 per presention.

# Supporting information for the Bookstock2018 grant application to the EDC

As you can see from our budget, there is a shortfall in income/expenses. We are hoping to cover this with a grant from the EDC but have not put it into the budget.

We would like to designate the EDC grant money to pay for our headliners this year (the bulk of the increase in 2018 expenses.) Robert Pinsky is a two time United States Poet Laureate and Richard Russo is a highly respected best-selling author. They have each agreed to present for much less than their usual fees but also require travel and lodging expenses. We estimate that will be about \$3500.

Our publicity foregrounds these two wonderful writers and their attendence at Bookstock is a feather in the cap of a literary festival put on by a small Vermont town and speaks to the strength and cultural interest of our community.




