V. POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT

- A. August 2019 meters revenues are up a couple hundred dollars from August 2018.
- B. The parking spot that is now a handicapped spot in front of The Vermont Horse Country Store on Central Street is not an official handicapped space.
 - i. There is a meter, but it is not a legal handicapped spot in the ordinance.Ms. DiNatale and the Board have asked for Chief Blish to investigate this

- further. Ms. Fish believes that there used to be a handicap spot in the alleyway to the Post Office and that is no longer there.
- ii. Chief Blish would like to bag the meter until he finds out about the need of the parking spot and if it is warranted. Chief Blish will report back to the Trustees during the September 17th Joint Meeting.
- C. Chief Blish suggested to the Trustees that a mirror ordinance be established for cellphone use while driving, like the Village has done with other State Statutes. This would be a revision to Title 8 of the Village Ordinances. A mirror ordinance would allow the Town of Woodstock to accrue the fines, where now it is all going to the State of Vermont.
- D. The Police still have an open position for an officer. Chief Blish has not received any certified applications. The next opportunity to send an applicant to the academy would be in February. Chief Blish would have to have the paperwork in by December to get a person into the academy.
- E. CAUTION: School has started and please be aware of children and school busses.
- F. School Drop-Off location on Cross Street. Chief Blish has talked to the WES Principal about this location and the approval of the Trustees for this location. The location has not been used yet but may be utilized soon.
